Synopsis: This Ordinance is being presented by the Administration for Council's review and approval. This Ordinance is the first amendment to the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating Budget, which was enacted in Substitute No. 1 to Ordinance No. 23-012. This amendment contains changes to the Fiscal Year 2024: (1) Position Allocation List; (2) Executive and Managerial Position Level Salary Structure Matrix, Declared Rates for Department Heads, and Executive and Managerial Pay Plan; and (3) Non-Union Pay Scale, which are incorporated into the revised Attachments "A", "B", and "C" that are attached to this Ordinance. These changes are to implement the recommendations of a recent compensation study.

Synopsis: This Ordinance is being presented by the Administration for Council's review and approval.
