

MISSION AND OVERVIEW

A partnership between the Wilmington Police Department and ChristianaCare, the Wilmington Partners in Care Program pairs trained mental health clinicians with police officers, who respond as a team to calls for service and conduct proactive outreach to support those in need in our community. Launched in March 2024, our program includes a case manager and two clinicians.

The third quarter of 2024 saw the continued growth of our pilot program, and the expanded reach of this initiative in the community. The team has reported a 32% increase in new clients compared with the second quarter, and our case manager and clinicians have been attending community events and conducting outreach to raise awareness of our partnership.

THIRD QUARTER BREAKDOWN

In the third quarter of 2024, a total of 128 individuals received services, including <u>115 new clients</u> and 13 clients who have been receiving continued assistance dating back to a prior quarter.
