### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF

THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that the Department of Public Works' grant application to the State of Delaware Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Public Health, for an Emerging Contaminants in Small or Disadvantaged Communities Grant in an amount not to exceed Two Million Four Hundred Two Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars (\$2,402,926.00) is hereby authorized.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Commissioner of Public Works, or her designee, shall be authorized to take all necessary actions to accept any and all funds associated with the grant application and to fulfill the grant requirements.

**FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:** There is no negative fiscal impact to the City because no local matching funds are required by this grant.

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE AN EXTENSION OF THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT BETWEEN COMCAST OF NEW CASTLE COUNTY, LLC AND THE CITY OF WILMINGTON

**FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:** This Ordinance shall bring in a minimum of \$90,000 per year in PEG channel support, totaling a minimum of \$450,000 over the life of the five-year contract. This Ordinance also requires Comcast to remit to the City the maximum five percent (5%) franchise fee allowed by the Comcast Act. That number is inexact, as the number of subscribers and types of cable subscriptions will vary.
