WHEREAS, these funds will be used to support Small Business Saturdays. This initiative provides small businesses with a marketplace, located on 3rd Street, where they can showcase handmade crafts, artisanal products, specialty services, and other goods to the community; and

WHEREAS, Small Business Saturdays are hosted at the Milk and Honey Coffeehouses. The Saturday events provide entrepreneurs with tables, signage, and other necessary supplies; furnish a welcoming space for community members to shop; and engage local performers to attract a wider audience to the site.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON that this Council hereby approves the issuance of a grant to Developing Next-Level Achievers, Inc. (DNLA) in the amount of \$3,000. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this grant contribution is in accordance with the 2022-2025 Wilmington City Council Strategic Plan goal of fostering a "Business Friendly Wilmington" that "provides resources for Neighborhood Business Corridors."

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT: This Ordinance shall bring in a minimum of \$90,000 per year in PEG channel support, totaling a minimum of \$450,000 over the life of the five-year contract. This Ordinance also requires Comcast to remit to the City the maximum five percent (5%) franchise fees allowed by the Cable Act. That number is inexact, as the number of subscribers and types of cable subscriptions will vary.
